Proposed Formal Policy Changes - Statutory

AB 1935 (Irwin). Community Colleges: Tutoring

- Proposes to amend section 84757(a)(10) of the Education Code as follows:

(10) Supervised tutoring for *basic skills, and for* degree-applicable and transfer-level courses, as authorized pursuant to regulations adopted by the board of ~~governors~~ *governors on or before July 31, 2019*.

Proposed Formal Policy Changes - Statutory

SB 1009 (Wilk). Community Colleges: Tutoring

Proposes to amend section 84757 of the Education Code as follows:

(11) ~~Tutoring~~ *Supervised tutoring* for courses and classes *as described in pertinent provisions of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations* in all subject areas that are either basic skills, degree applicable, or transfer level, irrespective of whether a student being tutored has been referred to tutoring by a faculty member or has self-initiated the tutoring.

SEC. 3. The Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges shall amend Section 58170 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations, as soon as feasible, to include student-initiated tutoring in accordance with Section 84757 of the Education Code.

Proposed Formal Policy Changes - Regulatory

Title 5, § 58170. Apportionment for Tutoring.

- Student self-referrals for tutoring
- Consultation Council review (April 19, 2018)
- BOG 1st reading (May 2018)
- BOG 2nd reading (Jul 2018)
- If BOG approves -> Dept. of Finance -> Secretary of State (posted 30 days for public comment)



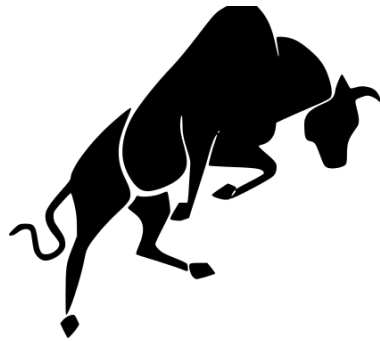
Updates on Existing Policy

- Funding Tutors
 - Combining general funds with categorical funds
- Online Tutoring
 - Tutors need to be employees of the district
 - Tutoring through the tutoring center
 - Tutoring needs to be supervised
