



Using Peer-Assisted Learning to Increase Engagement & Student Retention

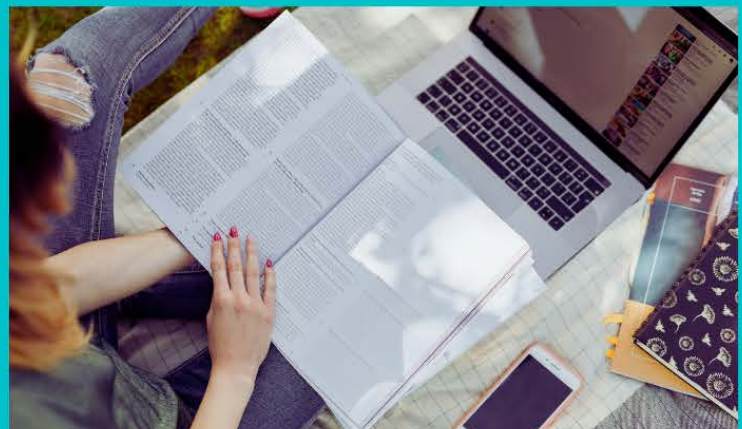
